The Five Major World Religions

Week one: Hinduism: Oldest major religion. Began 3,000
BC. The third largest (1 billion people). Began in India.
Believe in reincarnation: each soul is to gain more information,
moving between hundreds or thousands of lives as plants,
animals, or humans. Karma is the sum of the good or bad
done in a lifetime & determines if the next life is better or worse
than before. Believe in non-violence & are often vegetarian.
Believe God is beyond humans cannot be known by humans.

Week two: Buddhism: Began as a reform movement of
Hinduism in 500 BC when Siddhartha Gautama became “the
enlightened one” (the Buddha). As in Hinduism, Buddhists
believe in reincarnation and karma. Nirvana is their ultimate
destination. Many do not believe there is a God. Buddhists do
not believe in a soul, but instead Nirvana is reached when a
person's “life energy” is released into the universe. Buddhists
try to overcome the suffering in the world by separating
themselves from desiring for and clinging to the people and the
things of the world.

Last Sunday: Judaism: Believe in one God who created the
universe and four thousand years ago chose Abraham and his
descendants (the Israelites) to represent God to the people of
the world. The Hebrew scriptures (that we call the Old
Testament of the Bible) contains the Jewish law, history,
wisdom literature, and words from their prophets. Later, there
were also interpretations of the scriptures called The Talmud.
Some Jews believe in an afterlife, and some do not. The
Hebrew people are still waiting on their Messiah.
